Primary Purpose

The Locksmith installs, maintains, and repairs locks, doors, and security systems, including both mechanical and electronic key card systems, while ensuring the integrity of the district's master key system, responding to emergency work orders, and following safety procedures to maintain secure, safe environments for all district facilities.

Major Responsibilities and Duties

Maintenance and Repair

- 1. Interpret the Master Keying Guide and apply specialized knowledge of lock systems to maintain the integrity of the district's master key system while fulfilling customer requests
- 2. Install, service, and repair various types of locks, security devices, door hardware, and hydraulic closing fixtures
- 3. Disassemble, repair, and replace worn tumblers, springs, and other lock components
- 4. Cut new or duplicate keys, ensuring proper identification stamps

- 5. Troubleshoot, repair, and maintain mechanical and electronic key card systems
- 6. Receive, complete, and prioritize work orders; respond promptly to emergency requests
- 7. Maintain accurate records of work performed and ensure completion of tasks to standards
- 8. Inspect completed jobs for cleanliness, removing excess materials as needed, and ensure proper maintenance of equipment

- 9. Perform preventive maintenance on tools and equipment, ensuring they are in safe operating condition
- 10. Adhere to established safety protocols for lifting, climbing, and operating tools and equipment
- 11. Identify and correct unsafe work conditions, reporting non-immediate hazards to the supervisor
