Teaches courses in social studies, history, geography, American government, and civics to middle school students utilizing the course of study adopted by the Board of Education, and other appropriate learning activities as guidelines in teaching individual course content.

Develops knowledge of the purpose, structure, and operation of the American government and economic system, and the rights and responsibilities of American citizenship.

Develops rigorous lesson plans to teach a balanced social studies program involving factual background material, current events, discussion time, and debates designed to encourage students to develop skills and attitudes, draw conclusions, and make informed and reasoned decisions as citizens of a culturally diverse society.

Develop lesson plans and instructional materials and provide individualized and small group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to the needs of each student.

Deliver lessons using a variety of differentiated instructional techniques that are appropriate to the reading and writing instruction and to meet the diverse needs of students.

Develop students' verbal skills including discussion and debate, develop students' writing skills, and encourage the development of critical thinking skills.

Strong interpersonal and collaboration skills with the ability to communicate effectively and respectfully with all constituents.

Collaborates well with colleagues of diverse backgrounds on pedagogical approaches, curricular alignment, and instructional strategies.

Participation in collaborative grade-level meetings and PLC meetings to assist in the analysis and utilization of assessment data to improve the focus of instructional planning and student achievement.

Demonstrates a strong understanding of how to utilize teaching technology, writing checklists, and Google Comments for writing instruction. Demonstrate a strong understanding of various formative and summative assessment tools.
