The Dyslexia Student Support Teacher will provide targeted academic assistance to 504 and dyslexia students by identifying students' learning needs and developing and implementing personalized student learning plans based on data The SST will collaborate with teachers and parents to identify wrap around services for students, as needed

Qualifications:

Education/Certification:

Bachelor's Degree from an accredited university Valid Texas teaching certificate appropriate to subject and grade level assigned Dyslexia support training (preferred)

Special Knowledge/Skills:

Proven ability to close achievement gaps in struggling students in the content of E/SLAR Specific knowledge of grade level TEKS

Knowledge of federal, state, and local 504 and dyslexia compliance requirements and reporting

Ability to interpret data and provide student academic support accordingly

Ability to implement remediation strategies to support struggling readers

Experience in professional learning development and delivery to adult learners

Knowledge of district and local resources to support students' wraparound needs

Ability to plan, organize, and work with committees

Ability to complete tasks in a timely manner

Ability to work in a team environment relating in a positive manner with colleagues, supervisors, students, and parents.

Strong organizational, communication, and interpersonal skills

Experience:

Three years of effective classroom teaching experience in providing effective support to struggling readers

Major Responsibilities and Duties:

- 1. Provide high quality instruction to individual and small groups of students to provide educational interventions and progress monitoring.
- 2. Compile, maintain, and file all required reports, records, and other documents.
- 3. Meet with teachers to collaborate on lessons for the targeted students that are aligned with classroom instructional practices.
- 4. Effectively collaborate with teachers to meet the goals of the targeted students through individualized and small group sessions.



- 5. Ensure the implementation of the Multi Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) instructional system to increase student achievement.
- 6. Collect and maintain all MTSS data (lists of eligible students, intervention plans).
- 7. Support teachers in documenting student progress.
- 8. Set performance goals for individual students based upon assessment data.
- 9. Utilize a variety of teaching practices and methodologies that reflect diverse educational, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds in order to meet the individual needs of students.
- 10. Participate in district professional learning.

Mental Demands/Physical Demands/Environmental Factors:

Tools/Equipment Used: Personal computer and peripherals; standard instructional equipment

Posture: Prolonged standing; frequent kneeling/squatting, bending/stooping, pushing/pulling, and twisting

Motion: Frequent walking; frequent district and occasional statewide travel

Physical Demands/Environmental Factors: Exposure to childhood communicable diseases; good general health and stamina needed; driving between campuses; lifting and carrying

Mental Demands: Ability to communicate effectively (verbal and written); ability to instruct and maintain confidentiality; maintain emotional control under stress
