IOB SUMMARY:

- This position is responsible for the coordination, development and implementation of instructional programs, coordinating curriculum related matters and developing professional development programs for the professional staff.
- This position is responsible for coordinating state and district assessments.
- The contract period for this position is 12 months (260 days).
- Under broad supervision, this position directly supervises personnel assigned by the Assistant Superintendent of Teaching and Learning.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Collaborates with staff and administrators on instruction and assessment projects and processes
- 2. Coordinate the planning, implementation and evaluation of curriculum development and adoption across content areas
- 3. Coordinates, supervises and evaluates instructional coaches and interventionists
- 4. Assist in the coordination of the planning, implementation and evaluation of professional development programs for teachers and paraprofessionals
- 5. Create, conduct or subcontract professional development that is aligned to D87 mission and goals along with the district improvement plan
- 6. Assist administrators and teachers in the interpretation and implementation of state and federal mandates, including Illinois Learning Standards
- 7. Evaluate and recommend technology applications to support instruction in accordance with SOPPA federal legislation
- 8. Lead the development, implementation and evaluation of the district's MTSS plan with support from the Assistant Director of Student Services
- 9. Plan, implement and provide professional support for all staff of the school district, including the planning of school institutes, in collaboration with HR and the Assistant Superintendent of Teaching and Learning
- 10. Conduct task forces for curriculum review and revision, including instructional materials and teaching strategies
- 11. Evaluate instructional materials to curriculum standards, maps and pacing guides
- 12. Collaborate with other district administrators on the design, implementation and evaluation of instructional programs, services and area schedules
- 13. Participate in the implementation of the Title I program, including but not limited to, coordinating the personnel and grant reporting measures for Title I Federal Grant
- 14. Manage all district-wide and contracted local student assessments and report as necessary
- 15. Assist administrators and teachers with creation and implementation of School Improvement Plans and activities
- 16. Evaluate and implement data from the Student Information System to assist with federal requirements from Illinois State Board of Education and Department of Education
- 17. Other duties as assigned by the Assistant Superintendent of Teaching and Learning
