ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Supervise assigned school bus drivers and/or monitors; make recommendations concerning disciplinary actions necessary to correct and/or eliminate performance issues.
- Establish safe, efficient, and effective bus routes and stops that comply with local policies and procedures.
- Engage in consistent efforts to maintain a positive culture, climate, and morale in the assigned district and department.
- Manage daily operations of transportation services provided to assigned schools and areas.
- Provide instruction in proper use and handling of all transportation vehicles and equipment.
- Review accidents that occur on assigned routes, make reports and implement corrective action when driver performance is deficient.
- Develop and maintain a high level of familiarity/expertise with the roads, schools, and traffic flow patterns in the areas served.
- Inspect road conditions involved in bus routes; make follow-up recommendations for corrections.
- Train new drivers on assigned routes, effective student/behavior management techniques, pre and post trip inspections, monthly service requirements, and fueling.
- Assist in securing substitute bus drivers and monitors.
- Obtain data, maintain records, and otherwise provide requested information that supports the delivery of safe, orderly, and respectful transportation services.
- Communicate effectively with drivers, students, parents, school administrators, and supervisors on matters concerning transportation and work
 to resolve routine conflicts regarding requests and/or concerns.
- Serve as a liaison between district transportation personnel, Transportation Supervisors, and the Chief of Transportation; relay needs and instructions as required.
- Disseminate information on routes to transportation personnel and stakeholders.
- Complete required data entry, such as seating assignments, route assignments, student counts, route start times, and daily student assignments for new and relocated students, etc.
- Assist with emergencies and adjustments due to accidents, weather, breakdowns, or changes in school schedules..
- Perform other duties as assigned.
