## **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

- 1. Must be able to develop and implement student IEP's.
- 2. Observe and record characteristics of students in areas of language, perceptual, sensorymotor, intellectual, social, emotional and vocational development.
- 3. Measure or evaluate the developmental areas and identify patterns of strengths and weaknesses in the learning modalities of the student.
- 4. Establish goals including transition and develop learning tasks in a sequential order, leading to the development of skills in a specific area.
- 5. Select and plan sequential instructional activities to teach a task or concept, including the materials and equipment necessary to carry out the activity.
  - 6. Develop or modify instructional materials to meet the need of a learning activity.
- 7. Implement learning activities in group or individual instructional setting, including evaluation of student performance.
- 8. Design and utilize behavior modification techniques to deal with deviant student behavior and/or to gain a higher level of student performance.
- 9. Keep thorough ongoing records of student performance, including student achievement, placement documents, IEP's, medical information, and any other student records according to district policy.
  - 10. Organize and report pupil progress and behavior to parents or guardians.
- 11. Counsel with parents or guardians regarding their child's handicap in reference to education, vocation, socialization, emotions and life goals.
  - 12. Interact with and supervise para-educators as part of the instructional team.
- 13. Function as a member of a professional team involved in making decisions regarding curriculum development and program improvement.
  - 14. Assume responsibility for requisitioning and maintaining needed equipment and supplies.
  - 15. Identify community resources as an extension of the instructional program.
  - 16. Must comply with state mandates for the education of verified students.
