Preferred Skill Sets:

- Ability to build relationships with students, administration, other staff members and the community
- Understanding of how to use data to select and inform priorities, improvements, and to make decisions
- Ability to develop and meet timelines for completion of projects, tasks, and activities
- Willingness to engage in continued professional learning to enhance individual skill sets related to this position
- Ability to accept coaching supports and feedback from individual(s) assigned to support the position
- Understanding of how Teacher-Based-Teams (TBTs), Building Leadership Teams (BLTs), and District Leadership Teams (DLT) can improve educational outcomes for students.
- Effective oral and written communication skills, including presentation skills
- Belief that all students can learn
- Understands Multi-tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) and how they can be used to help all students excel academically and behaviorally
- Understands the importance of co-teaching, the different types of co-teaching, and how it can be implemented successfully in a general education classroom
- Serves as a resource for general education teachers on how students with disabilities can be effectively included in the general education classroom

Responsibilities:

- Complies with all Federal, State, and Local laws related to the education of students with disabilities
- Schedules and conducts IEP meetings in accordance with the established timelines and guidelines
- Writes rigorous, data based, individualized IEP goals for each assigned student

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- Monitors each student's progress in obtaining IEP goals and completes the required documentation
- Provides Specially Designed Instruction to all assigned students that align with the student's IEP goals and objectives.
- Communicates regularly with families regarding their child's progress in meeting goals and objectives
- Engages and collaborates with families, teachers, and administrators in the IEP planning process
- Co-teaches with general education teachers as assigned
- Prepare, in advance, high quality, research based, and standards based lessons to present to students on a daily basis
- Completes all district required training modules by established deadlines as required by board policy
- Evaluate individual students and instructional programs to monitor progress, differentiate instruction and measure program effectiveness
- Be an engaged participant in Teacher-Based-Teams (TBTs), Staff Meetings, and Professional Development activities
- Actively communicate students' progress to parents/guardians through online gradebooks, phone calls, emails, etc. Teachers should contact the parent of any child who is in danger of failing their class for the quarter
- Communicate positive classroom events to the administration and parents/guardians
- Use Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS), Restorative Practices, and Restorative Circles to foster a positive classroom climate
- Regularly update curriculum maps, unit plans, and pacing guides
- Differentiate instruction to reach all learners in the classroom
- Formatively assess students and use the results from those assessments to guide instruction
- Interpret and use data from state tests and diagnostic tests (MAP, Aimsweb, etc) to monitor and guide instructional priorities
- Completes all district required training modules by established deadlines as required by board policy

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Other Duties and Responsibilities:

- Serves as a role model for students in how to conduct themselves as citizens and as responsible, intelligent human beings including keeping a professional social media presence
- Helps instill in students the belief in and practice of ethical principles and democratic values; and
- Performs other duties related to the teacher's duties as assigned by the principal, assistant principal, and/or the superintendent of schools
