JOB SUMMARY

The School Nutrition Warehouse Manager assists in developing plans and procedures for carrying out the mission and policies of the School Nutrition program. This employee serves as support to the food service operations by operating and maintaining the Nutrition Department Warehouse and its services to ensure that inventory, storage, deliveries and other processes are handled in accordance with Federal, State, and Local standards.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Performs general warehouse duties to include receipt, storage, and maintenance of central dry and temperature controlled foods and supplies
- Develops and implements delivery system of goods from central storage to schools
- Communicates with Central Office on a regular basis regarding warehouse processes and procedures from central storage as well as for individual schools
- Maintains inflow and outflow of food and supplies for program
- Documents accurate records for proper temperature maintenance of refrigeration equipment and requests service as needed
- Maintains central delivery truck to include requests for maintenance, cleaning, and security
- Maintains accountability system for acceptance of goods, delivery of goods and end of inventory
- Organizes warehouse by labeling stock and maintaining information on supplies, delivery availability, and level of usage
- Is familiar with current practices related to correct procedures of shipping, receiving, and storage of goods
- Arranges for pick-up of foods and supplies that are overstocked in the school storage area (kitchens), and for summer storage
- Assists managers with their day to day situations and concerns regarding receipt, storage, and availability of goods from central storage
- Unloads frozen foods from tractor trailer and places them in the freezer
- Loads and unloads delivery trucks for the purpose of receiving stock and/or filling orders for transport
- Maintains manual and electronic documents, files and records for the purpose of documenting activities and providing materials and reliable resource information
- Operates warehouse equipment for the purpose of moving large and heavy items safely and effectively
- Participates in physical inventories for the purpose of verifying stock and identifying losses.
- Prepares orders by pulling from stock for the purpose of meeting food delivery requirements
- Provides quality customer service for the purpose of maintaining an effective and efficient work environment
- Demonstrates excellent customer service skills with school staff and vendors at all times
- Assists with maintenance activities of warehouse and when time and expertise permit, helps with minimal school kitchen and cafeteria maintenance and odd jobs as requested
- Adheres to prescribed dress code
- Assists with transporting, set-up, and breaking down of catering and other functions
- Cleans warehouse for the purpose of maintaining a safe and sanitary work area

- Purchases designated items from local vendors according to purchasing policies as requested
- Maintains HACCP standards for warehouse and delivery vehicles
- Assists with delivery, set-up, serving, clearing and cleaning of satellite serving sites
- Pulls stock to fill daily food orders and delivers to schools on a timely basis
- Maintains confidentiality of records and information
- Understands and operates under FIFO (First in-First out) principles
- Follows all applicable safety rules
- Performs other related duties and responsibilities as assigned, for the purpose of ensuring the efficient and effective functioning of the nutrition department
- Maintains prompt and regular attendance
