JP II's mission is founded on the charism of Pope Saint John Paul II: *to educate young men and women who are intellectually strong, spiritually alive and committed to serving the needs of others.*

POSITION: Pope John Paul II High School is seeking a passionate and dedicated Spanish teacher to join our faculty and help students develop language proficiency from introductory to advanced levels. A successful candidate must be committed to helping students achieve their full potential by attending to their academic, emotional, and spiritual needs. The hired teacher will also be responsible for instructing various ability levels at the same time. They will be responsible for delivering engaging, thoughtful, and culturally rich Spanish lessons from Spanish 1 to Spanish 5. This teacher will help students build foundational skills and fluency in Spanish, as well as an appreciation for Spanish-speaking cultures around the world.

- Fluent in both English and Spanish.
- Has experience teaching high school or higher education Spanish.
- Holds a bachelors in Spanish, education, or related field.
- Has experience in teaching various levels of Spanish in a classroom setting.

- Has had at least one year of teaching at the high school level.
- Can foster healthy teacher-student relationships that develop the whole child.
