Job Description School Psychologist

TITLE: School Psychologist

REPORTS TO: Director of Pupil Services

OVERVIEW: The School Psychologist is directly responsible for the psychological assessment of academic, social, emotional, and behavioral domains utilizing problem-solving and standardized evaluations. The School Psychologist monitors the completion of case study evaluations and participates in Individual Education Plan (IEP) Planning and Placement Team (PPT) meetings designing systems, programs, and services that maximize students' social, emotional, and educational success. In collaboration with staff, families, students, and communities the school psychologist promotes effective educational environments. The School Psychologist provides individual/group counseling and crisis management counseling, as needed.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assists building and district staff in creating and delivering appropriate student support.
- Compiles information from a variety of sources (e.g. administrators, teachers, nurses, parents, mental health agencies, other professionals, etc.) for the purpose of producing a comprehensive screening/evaluation report in compliance with established guidelines.

- Has a strong understanding of MTSS for the purpose of interpreting the data to intervene, offering interventions, and guiding the referral process, as needed.
- IEP/504/Intervention counseling to support mental health, social skills, executive functioning, and self-regulation.
- Produce comprehensive assessment as per PPT recommendations.
- Crisis intervention including risk assessments, threat assessments, and behavior intervention.
- Receives administrative and technical supervision from the Director of Pupil Services and general supervision from the building principal.
