Position Responsibility: The MTSS After School Academic Enrichment Teacher will help students prepare for the rigors of daily mathematical, reading and SAT test-taking techniques. The teacher will identify and implement strategies in reading, writing, math and reasoning, to increase the overall cumulative grades and average student SAT score

Qualifications/Skills:

- Professional Educator License
- Training and/or experience in SAT or standardized test preparation
- Collecting, interpreting, and communicating data to a variety of audiences
- Ability to work as a member of a team
- Ability to use word processing and spreadsheet software
- Possess excellent organizational skills
- Ability to work effectively with administrators, teachers, students and parents
- Demonstrate knowledge of SAT strategies
- Disaggregation of various assessment data (e.g., local, state, and federal)

KEY FUNCTIONS:

A. Familiarize students with academic growth plan

- 1. Explain purpose of SAT
- 2. Detail objectives of each subsection of SAT and review of academic pre/post test
- 3. Communicate relevance of SAT to students and parents
- 4. Identifies, selects, and modifies evidence-based research supplemental materials to meet the needs of the students with varying backgrounds, learning styles, and special needs.
- 5. Communicates MTSS program and procedures to instructional staff and parent/guardians.
- 6. Assists instructional staff in acquiring and developing MTSS resources and materials to better meet the needs of identified students.
- 7. Works with School Improvement Team and Division Leaders as needed to ensure vertical and horizontal articulation for struggling identified students.

B. Assessment/Program Effectiveness

Pre-Test Assess student and program model success based on formative and summative data.

Prepares Weekly Supplemental Reports as required by the Office of Federal Programs

- 1. Monitors the implementation of MTSS process.
- 2. Collects and analyzes data to gage effectiveness of interventions.
- 3. Communicates data to staff, parents, and students.
- 4. Use data to help identify students who need additional support.

C. Professional Development

- 1. Participates regularly scheduled school improvement and parent meetings.
- 2. Facilitates professional development of staff members.
- 3. Supports attendance of staff at trainings, workshops, and conferences.
- 4. Models research based instructional practices and interventions for staff.
- 5. Uses data to assist teachers planning whole and small group instruction.
- 6. Helps teachers develop and implement classroom-based, developmentally appropriate interventions.

D. Communication

- 1. After school individual and group sessions with students to monitor their progress
- 2. Communicates to Administrator, Counselor, Dean and teachers
- 3. Celebrates student successes and accomplishments
- 4. Assists students in accepting themselves and understanding their physical, emotional and social growth.
